NOTIFICATION

Dated 17th September 1993.

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 17 of Bihar and Orissa Nurses Registration Act, 1935, the Governor of Bihar is pleased to make the following rules, the draft of which is published for general information and for the persons to be affected thereby and notice is given that any objection or suggestion may be sent to the undersigned within thirty days from the date of its publication.

2. Any objection or suggestion received on or before the expiry of the said period shall be duly considered by the State Government.

DRAFT OF RULES

1. *Short title, extent and commencement.*—These rules may be called the Recognition, Affiliation & conduct of Examinations of Nursing Schools Rules, 1993.—

- (a) This extends to the whole of the State of Bihar.
(b) This shall come into force at once.

2. *Definition.*—In this rules unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context :—

- (i) 'Act' means the Bihar and Orissa Nurses Registration Act, 1935.
(ii) 'Council' means the Bihar Nursing Registration Council, constituted under section 3 of the Act.
(iii) 'Indian Nursing Council' means the Nursing Council Constituted under the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947.
(iv) 'Director-in-chief' means the Head of the Department of Health (originally designated as 'Inspector-General of the Civil Hospitals under the Act').
(v) 'Government' means the Government of the State of Bihar.
(vi) 'Nursing Training' means the training imparted in the school as Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (A.N.M.) General Nursing Midwifery (G.N.M.) and B.Sc. (Nursing).
(vii) 'President' means President of the Council constituted under section 3 of the Act.
(viii) Registrar means 'Registrar' appointed under section 7 of the Act.

3. Power to organise, manage or permit, etc. except as otherwise provided in these rules no person shall :—

- (a) Organise, manage or permit any institution to undertake, conduct, provide or confer any instruction in the branches of training in Auxiliary midwife and general Nursing Midwifery course.
(b) Proposed method of recruitment and service condition of teaching staff.
(c) Proposed number of students to be admitted in the year of starting of courses of study, the basis of their selection, the scale of fee to be charged and projection of plan with regard to increase the number of annual admission.

4. *Undertaking for permission.*—The applicant shall undertake :—

- (a) That the institution will not be established and run for private gain or profit.

- (b) That any change of management affected after the application shall forthwith be reported to the State Government.
- (c) That all moneys collected by way of fees or donations or in any other form shall be credited to the College/School funds and shall form part of the revenue of the College/School.
- (d) That the number of yearly admission will not be increased at any time without prior approval of the State Government.
- (e) That the instructions will be imparted in accordance with the standards laid down by the Indian Nursing Council of India.

5. *Eligibility for permission/recognition/affiliation of the institution.*—No institution shall be granted permission/recognition unless it fulfils, the minimum requirement for setting up school of nursing as provided under the Indian Nursing Council syllabi and regulation for course in general Nursing Midwifery, 1986 revised standard with regard to teaching staff, physical facilities, clinical facilities, hostel facilities as provided under the said regulation.

6. *Inspection before permission and recognition.*—(1) The Government shall constitute a committee of three persons, one of whom shall be an expert in Nursing Education, to inspect the school and to see whether the school fulfils the criteria as fixed for the recognition of the school. The appointment of inspectors shall be made by the Government or Directorate within a period of one month from the date of filing of the application by the school for recognition. The inspectors shall inspect the school within one month from the date of communication of their appointment as Inspectors.

(2) The inspecting personnel shall give detail report regarding facilities available in the institution and fulfilment of conditions as provided under the Indian Nursing Council Regulation. On receipt of inspection report, the Government shall consider the same and take a decision regarding grant of recognition/affiliation. It shall be opened to the Government to take into consideration the sufficiency of existing schools, further requirement of new schools, requirement of trained nurses and such other matter as it may deem fit and proper.

7.(1) Notwithstanding any thing contained in the Act and regulations, the State Government shall have power to nominate three persons from Department of Health, Medical Education and Family Welfare, Health Services on the Governing Body of the private nursing institutions.

(2) The State Government may give direction to the private institution for determining recruitment rules of teachers, service conditions, scale of pay, teaching staff, minimum or maximum age, etc.

(3) The State Government shall in no way and at no time be responsible for any financial liabilities for the maintenance of the private Institutions.

8.(1) The institution established with the permission of the Government and granted affiliation by the council shall be inspected by the team of inspectors under section 8.

1.(a) The cost of the inspection will be born by the concerned Institutions :—

(i) At the time of inspection the committee may be taken into consideration the following :—

1. Building & area.
2. Teaching staff.
3. Library.
4. Equipments and laboratory.
5. Play ground.
6. Lecture teatre.
7. Cash in account.
8. Vehicles and such other matter prescribed under rules, regulations framed by the Indian Nursing Council from time to time.

- (ii) The committee shall submit a report with regard to eligibility for recognition.
- (iii) If such institutions do not fulfil condition as per criteria laid down under the Indian Nursing Council regulation, such institution shall be given six months time and if the institution within six months time fulfil the requirement a fresh recognition shall be granted.
- (iv) If the institution fails to comply with the conditions for recognition within the said six month time, the recognition granted, if any may be withdrawn.

9. *Period for application.*—(i) The institution functioning without prior permission of the State Government, irrespective of the fact that they are recognised by the council shall apply for permission within a period of one month from the date of coming into force of these rules and shall not admit any student from the date of coming into force of these rules, till permission is granted.

(ii) The State Government shall examine the case of each institution and shall take decision for grant of permission within three months.

(iii) In case they do not take such application within the abovementioned period or the State Government refuses to give permission they shall be deemed to have contravened these rules and shall be liable for prosecution.

10. *Admission.*—(i) Admission of students shall be regulated by the State Government and only those who fulfil minimum qualification provided under the Indian Nursing Council Regulation shall be admitted through competitive test in each Institution.

(ii) Reservation in admission shall be in accordance with percentage fixed by the State Government for appointment in service:

Provided that seven per cent of the seats shall be kept apart for admission in G.N.M. or A.N.M. from amongst the persons who are in State Service or on the post of Midwife or Lady Health Visitors. The percentage reserved for admission under these categories may be varied by the State Government from time to time as per requirement in the service.

11. The final examination of G.N.M., A.N.M. and L.H.V. shall be conducted by the Bihar Nursing Registration Council as per the syllabus prescribed by the Indian Nursing Council as mentioned in the Indian Nursing Council Act, 1947 amended from time to time.

12. The Entrance Examination shall be conducted under the supervision and control of Director-in-chief, Health Services or Director/Addl. Director (F. W.) and there shall be one common examination as fixed by the State Government for all the institution including Government institution in different faculties or subjects.

13. Director-in-chief, Health Services or Addl. Director (F. W.) shall determine the name of persons as question setters for examination in different subjects and shall be responsible for setting questions and conduct of examination.

Competitive Test (Entrance Examination)

14. Admission of student (Entrance Examination) shall be regulated by the State Government and only those who fulfil the eligibility criteria stated below, shall be admitted.

- (a) For Auxiliary Nurses Midwife course a candidate who has passed the Matriculation examination or the equivalent examination from any of the Board recognised by Bihar School Examination Board and the Bihar Intermediate Examination with Science, shall be eligible to appear in the test for General Nursing Midwifery course.

- (b) (i) The candidates for admission in Auxillary Nurse Midwife course and General Nursing Midwifery courses are required to have obtained the minimum age of 16 and 17 years respectively and their upper age-limit shall be thirty years.
- (ii) Admission to the said G. N. M. course shall be only once in a year.
- (iii) And the date of birth mentioned in the Board Certificate or Admit Card issued by the School Examination Board shall only be acceptable.
- (c) A candidate must be a citizen of India and must fulfil one of the following criteria for residence in Bihar :—
- (i) A candidate whose father/mother (in case father is not alive) is a permanent resident of Bihar/domicile in Bihar for not less than 10 years can apply upon production of a certificate to this effect from D.M.//Civil S. D. O. of the area of Residence.
- (ii) Daughters of Central Government employees on duty in the State of Bihar on the date of filling application can also apply upon production of a certificate to this effect from Head of the Department/office under whom, such Government employees are working.
- (iii) Daughters of Bihar Government Employees including daughters of members of all India services born on Bihar State cadre can also apply upon production of a certificate to this effect from Head of the Department/office under whom such Government employees are working.
- (iv) Candidates whose parents are not alive can also apply on production of a certificate to this effect from the District Magistrate or S.D.O. of their area of Residence and to the effect that the candidate is a permanent resident of Bihar.

NOTE.—(i) A candidate who claims eligibility on the ground that his/her father or mother (in case of father is not alive) or he/she herself (in case both father and mother are not alive) has been residing in the State of Bihar for the last 10 years continuously or is a permanent resident of the State of Bihar must furnish a certificate from the District Magistrate or the Civil S.D.O. of the area.

- (ii) The candidate who have not studied in Bihar but claim eligibility on ground of permanent/continuous residence of their parents for the last 10 years in Bihar must in addition to the above certificate also furnish a certificate from the Institution where he studied or is studying for the qualifying examinations indicating the permanent address recorded in the admission register of that institution.

15. Standard of Examination :

The standard of examination for A. N. M. Course shall be Matriculation or equivalent recognised by Bihar School Examination Board and for the G. N. M. course the student shall be intermediate with science.

16. Subject of Examination :

The subjects for examination shall be :

For A. N. M. Course—English and Hindi.

For G. N. M. Course—Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Hindi and English.

17. Scheme of Examination :

Question for both of the said competitive test will be of subjective type, but if desired it may be changed to objective type.

18. Distribution of Marks :

For G. N. M. Course :

Subject	Full marks	Minimum Qualifying Marks.
Physics	100	33 %
Chemistry	100	33 %
Biology	100	33 %
Hindi and English ..	50+50	33 % each

19. Pattern of Examination :

The examination for both A.N.M. and G. N. M. course will be one theory paper consisting 400 marks and three hours duration.

20. Schedule of Examination :

- (a) The examination will be held in one sitting and will be of three hours duration.
 (b) Date of examination .. To be decided by Government.
 (c) Last date and time of receipt of application form To be decided by Government.
 (d) Last date for sale of application form .. To be decided by Government.
 (e) Sale of application form to start from To be decided by the Government.

NOTE—The schedule of examination may change under unavoidable circumstances as decided by the Government.

21. The Application Form :

- (a) Must be for the session.
 (b) Must be correctly filled in applicant's own handwriting.
 (c) Must be signed by the applicant and her parent/guardian (if parents not alive) at appropriate place.
 (d) Applicant's signature must be duly attested by the Principal of the School/ College in which the candidate studied last or is studying, with his seal.

22. The photostat copies of the following documents duly signed by the candidate must be sent alongwith the application form.

- (a) Photostat copy of the mark-sheet of Bihar Secondary Examination Board, Examination in case of candidate appearing for A. N. M. course and marks obtained in Intermediate Examination for candidate appearing for G. N.M. Course.
 (b) Photostat copy of certificate from the principal concerned that the candidate has appeared at the Secondary Examination or equivalent examination or Intermediate examination for G. N. M. course, In case, the result of such examination has not been published, the certificate must contain the names of subjects in which the candidate appeared.
 (c) Photostat copy of certificate/certificates in support of residence applicable to the candidates.
 (d) Photostat copy of documentary evidence of the date of birth.

- (e) Photostat copy of Character Certificate from the Principal of the College in which the candidate studied last for G. N. M. course and the same from the Head Master in the case of application for A. N. M. course.
- (f) Duly attested passport size (Recent front view) photograph of the candidate must be pasted in the space provided on the application form and admit card.
- (g) Photostat copy of the caste Certificate from the District Magistrate or Civil S. D. O. or District Welfare Officer or Block Development Officer of the area of his residence if the candidate belongs to Scheduled Caste/Tribe/Backward Class/A. B. C. and if he/she seeks admission against seats reserved for Schedule Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward classes.
- (h) In case a candidate seeks admission on the ground of being Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe, she must produce a certificate from the Principal of the School/Collage where the candidate studied last stating clearly that the candidate belongs to Scheduled Cast/Scheduled Tribe as per college register and that candidate was enjoying all benefits like free studentship, schoarship, etc. on account of her being a Scheduled Cast/Scheduled Tribe
- (i) For such candidates who have not enjoyed the above benefits the Principal has to specify the reason.
- (j) Affidavit for any document will not be accepted.

23. Admit card for admission to the test must :—

- (a) be correctly filled in Hindi.
- (b) bear the full signature (full name) of the candidate (not in capital letters) be attested by the Gazetted Officer or Principal of School/College, where she studied last.
- (c) be accompanied by two passport size Recent Front view photographs pasted in the space provided and duly attested by the Gazetted Officer or Principal of the college in which she studied or is studying for the qualifying examination.

24. Application will be received only by Registered post. In one envelope, only one application, can be sent.

25. A self-addressed and stamped envelope of 23 cm × 9 cm (9'' × 4'') size must be enclosed with the application for sending the Admit Card.

26. Submission of Application Form :

Application forms are to be sent to any of the following places (which will be mentioned in Advertisement) :

Students studied or studying for qualifying Examination outside Bihar State but claim eligibility under the clause will send their application to Health Directorate.

27. Issue of Admit Card :

(i) Admit card will be issued and despatched to the candidates atleast 10 days before the date of examination by Registered post to their correspondence address provided the candidate sends self-addressed envelope on his request slip.

(ii) In every centre there may be one or more sub-centre, i.e. exact place of examination. The place of examination, date and time of commencement of the test shall be noted on the admit card.

28. Examination Fee:

(A) The Government will take decision on this issue by executive orders as and when required.

29. Late application will not be considered and the authorities do not undertake any responsibility for delay or loss of application or any correspondence/Admit Card etc. during postal transit.

30. No Revaluation/Re-totalling of answer sheet be allowed and no correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

31. Candidate adopting Unfair means in the test shall be expelled from the test. Instructions to the examinees will be a part of the prospectus.

32. Candidates will be selected for admission strictly on the basis of merit subject to reservation of seats as per Government rules provided they are found medically fit at the time of admission.

33. Interest merit among securing equal aggregate marks at the competitive test shall be determined on the basis of marks secured in Biology group (Botany & Zoology) at the test. In case of a tie of this stage, the decision will be made on the basis of marks secured in zoology at the test, in case of continued tie the decision will rest on the marks obtained in case of continued tie the decision will rest on the marks obtained in chemistry in the test. If it still remains indecisive, the candidate passing the qualifying examination earlier will get preference, If there is still a tie seniority in the age would get preference.

34. Submission of incorrect or false documents, if detected at any stage before admission will lead to rejection of the candidature and if detected after admission to a college it will lead to cancellation of admission of the candidate and legal proceedings may be started against him and in case of any legal dispute in the matter the candidate will not be allowed to attend the classes and to appear in any examination till final judgement of the case.

35. College Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate from the college in which the candidate studied last will be required at the time of admission. If a candidate was studying in any other University/she should submit Migration Certificate within two months of her being admitted.

36. Preference of candidates for particular college(s) will be obtained at the time of scrutiny of documents and will be decided on the basis of merit-cum-choice. No change of preference will be allowed after the scrutiny of documents.

37. In case of a candidate being provisionally selected for admission letters will be given to the candidate or be sent by registered post only at the correspondence address given in the application form. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to have his forwarding address recorded at the post office concerned in case of change of her address. The candidature of such a candidate who fails to appear for the scrutiny of documents will be rejected.

38 If by mistake a candidate is allowed to sit at the test which otherwise would not have been possible and the error is subsequently detected at any stage before/after admission, the candidate will lose all rights and claims for admission even if she has competed successfully. In case of admitted candidates the admission will be cancelled.

39. (a) Reservation policy of Government will apply as per decision of the Government. *Mutatis Mutandis* Castes will be decided as per Approved SC/ST/BC/MBC list of Bihar Government.

(b) Candidates of reserved categories coming in General Merit list will be adjusted against the unreserved categories.

40. Candidate on being finally selected will have to take admission on the day mentioned in their call letters.

41. Any typing or typographical mistake during preparation and publication of the result does not ensure admission.

42. Constitution of Board of conducting common entrance examination :

The Government shall constitute board in following manners for conducting the examination.

The Chairman of the board shall preside all meetings and in his absence he will authorise any member of board and it will be responsibility of board to ensure compliance of Rules and conducting the examination fairly.

43. The centres of examination will be at all Districts Headquarters only or at all Medical Colleges. The Regional Dy. Director of Health will be over all incharge of examination at Divisional Headquarter level. The Director-in-chief will have power to change/cancel any centre of examination. The centre superintendent will be C.M.O.

44. The name of examiners, question setters will be confidential and should be teachers in reputed Colleges/Universities in their own subject.

45. Remuneration to Paper Setter and Examiners and concerned person :

(A) The Department will take decision on this issue by Executive orders as and when required.

(B) T. A. for journey inside State or outside State in connection with competitive Examination for Admission in G.N.M. and A.N.M. will be payable as per provision made in Bihar T.A. Rules.

46. Account :

An account will be opened in S.B.I., Secretariat Branch and all amount received as examination fee will be deposited in the same. The Director-in-chief and Additional Director (F. W.) will operate the account.

47. The Account will be audited by Chartered Accountant as fixed by Director-in-chief annually.

48. Any dispute arising out of or connected with rule shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Patna Court only.
